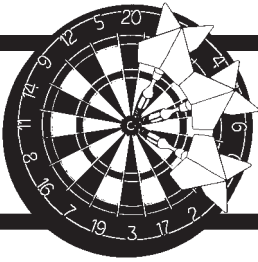

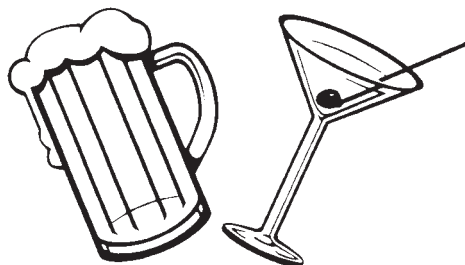

In Memory

Shawn M. Fischer, age 29, died on March 12, 2000. Since he was 14, Shawn had a passion for playing darts. He discovered the game while working at what used to be Marv's Bar and Lanes in North Minneapolis. Shawn was considered one of the best dart players in the nation and recently played on a team that won the 2000 Midwest Championship Open in the 301-team Masters Division.

Shawn was hospitalized on February 20th because of cellulitis, an inflammation of cellular tissues. He was a big man, at 6 feet, 2 inches tall and weighing 659 pounds, which prevented the doctors from being able to do an MRI to help diagnose his illness. "He fought for his life for three weeks, but the battle was lost because of his size," says his mother, Karen Fischer. "The doctors did everything they could, but it just wasn't in the cards."

Shawn Fischer will be sadly missed.

Hankey wipes Baxter right off the board

The poor chap did not stand a chance. The one they call the Count sank his fangs into the helpless neck of the man who challenged him, immediately drew blood and did not stop draining the life out of his victim until he lay, an empty shell, before him, utterly defeated.

The final of the Embassy world darts championship last night was one of those sporting occasions that thousands will claim they saw in the flesh. This was not sport, it was ritual slaughter.

Ted Hankey, the Dracula of darts, was confronted in the final at Frimley Green by Ronnie Baxter, the No 2 seed favored by the bookmakers and most of the 1,500 spectators at the Lakeside Club.

Hankey expected the battle of his life, but it never materialized as his brilliance and his opponent's terrible frailty when it mattered produced a hopelessly one-sided final.

Hankey took £44,000 after winning 6-0, the first time since 1994 that the final has been won with a whitewash, and he finished it in the grand manner. To check-out on 170 - a combination of two treble 20s and a bull's-eye - is a rarity, to finish a world championship final with that maximum feat has never been performed before. It is like six sixes in an over or a set of perfect tens on the gymnastics mat - and Hankey did it.

The match was over in less than an hour; and that included a half-time interval. By that time Baxter was already a beaten man, stumbling back to the sanctuary of the dressing-room 5-0 down and staring at the spectre of humiliation. The fight had been knocked out of him by the remorseless Hankey.

The first leg of the match revealed starkly the nerves and the unwanted adrenaline that was coursing through the veins of both men.

Between them they needed 56 darts to complete the leg, five times busting their score when they had out shots.

Hankey eventually won the leg with his fifth attempt at a double one - Baxter missed 12 attempts at the same bed. It was the last time Hankey was to show such hesitancy.

Baxter played well enough in the body of each set to give himself game-shot opportunities but faltered fatally on the closing doubles.

He had 24 game shots in the first five sets and missed 22 of them.

Nobody can give Hankey that many chances and survive - he is simply too powerful and clinical a finisher to let an opponent wriggle on the hook for long without bringing out the gaffe and killing him off.

It was hard not to feel a certain sympathy for Baxter, playing in his second final in as many years. He battled back to beat Colin Monk in sudden death in the final set of their quarter-final, then produced similarly powerful form to brush aside Co Stompe, the Amsterdam tram driver, 5-2 in the semi-final. He must have hoped, and been optimistic. Instead, he was simply swept away by one of the great performances in the history of this championship. ●
