



Dart Etiquette Tips for Chalkers

- Do not..... talk or move about while keeping score.
Remain still.
- Do not..... look at the shooter.
Stand facing the scoreboard.
- Do not..... lean out to see where a dart is,
or follow the darts with body or head movement.
- Do not..... call out the score of thrown darts,
or the score remaining – unless asked.
- Do not..... tell a shooter what to shoot,
or what combinations to shoot, for an out.
- Do not..... show signs of disgust or excitement when chalking.
Be impartial.
- Do not..... change a score if that player has shot again
and a second score is written down.
- Do not..... change the sides of the players on the scoreboard
in three-leg matches. If a player or team starts on the left,
leave them on the left, regardless of the diddles.
- All chalking... shall be done on scoreboard in view of shooters,
not behind them at a table.
